The gardens are a pleasant place to escape summer heat without being stuck indoors. It is particularly cool in the Fernery, in the deep shade of the Purple Beech tree *Fagus sylvatica* 'Atropunicea' and under the Maiden Hair tree *Ginkgo biloba*.
